RUTGERS School of Health Professions

Starting on March 13, 2018, Rutgers University will be offering a new 12 credit undergraduate University certificate program accredited through the Rutgers University School of Health Professions (SHP) in collaboration with Rutgers University Behavioral Health Care (RUBHC). This academic program is designed to provide knowledge and skills as well as a practicum experience for those who wish to become effective peer support providers in a variety of settings.

Credits completed in this academic Certificate program can be applied toward undergraduate course requirements for an Associate in Science (A.S.) or Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree. The program can be completed in one year over three semesters (March, May, September).

Those enrolled in the Academy of Peer Services or other state certification programs may apply for admission to the RU Certificate. If accepted, they will be required to complete all assignments and elements of the program. No prior learning experiences or work experiences will be accepted as a substitute for the Certificate's required coursework.


